
Tom Selleck

Tom Selleck was born in Detroit, Michigan. The family moved to Sherman Oaks, California, during Selleck's childhood, where Tom excelled as a pitcher in a local Babe Ruth league.

A talented collegiate athlete, Selleck supported himself as a model, winning small parts in films and television during the 1970s. He received his big break in 1979 when he was cast in the starring role of CBS' detective series, *Magnum PI*. The top-rated show earned Selleck an Emmy and a Golden Glove, and he continued with the role for eight years.

Selleck has appeared in more than fifty film and television roles since his initial success with *Magnum Pi*, including a co-starring role in the highest grossing movie of 1987, *Three Men and a Baby; Quigley Down Under; Mr. Baseball;* and *Lassiter*, to name a few.
